The 40 Days of The Son of Man

(Before the Tribulation Begins)

Today's teaching is truly of great importance! And even though I fully understand most will not believe... for the bible told me so. I know I must share it and make it as clear as I can for those it may reach now and for those it will reach during that time. This period of time, as you'll come to see, is not for the Bride of Christ. You'll understand that she was removed just a little prior to this time, in what we call the Escape. Some will call it the rapture, but it is not. This is called the Pre Tribulation Escape or as Paul told us in **2Cor.12:2** "... <u>such as</u> one caught up...", which means "<u>like</u>" a rapture. Whereas, Paul then goes on to tell us of another type of event in which he says in **2Cor.12:4** "... <u>was</u> caught up.". This second event mentioned "<u>is</u>" the rapture most all speak of, which will be the great multitude. And that one will take place at the end of the Seal judgements. Hopefully you will have already come to understand this in the first and second videos in the series that I refer to as, the <u>**2 Keys of End**</u> <u>**Time Understanding**</u>. Here they are if you haven't.

Now, let's get into the revelation of this before I get too sidetracked with everything else that connects to it. I will pray that if this is the first teaching you come across from this ministry, that you will listen, take in the understanding and ask the Lord in prayer to show it to you. Then I would watch the other 2 teachings above. They're only 30 minutes each. And are the most important videos to give you the foundation of understanding what's being revealed here today, about the Son of man's 40 days!



Ministry Revealed

It's not an easy subject to share! However, once you've come to understand the two videos above. It becomes very easy to see. That's how important those two videos are. And once you start to unlock it... you'll understand that it all begins with a portion of time, that our Brother Paul tells us about in **2Cor.12:2** I knew a man in Christ "**ABOVE**" 14 years ago, First off yes, 14 years ago, he says? Again this brings us back to the videos above:) But for our topic today we're looking at this "<u>above</u>" portion he's referring to! First of all, it must be less than 15 years or he would have said, above 15 years? *The mystery of it, is how much "<u>above</u>" the 14 years and what takes place during that time?*

I find it so interesting when this topic is brought up to other Christians. Their first reaction and usually their final reaction is, <u>No! No chance! You have No idea what you're talking about!</u> Yet very, very few take any time to look into any of it? But I understand the main reason why they do this. And to understand why for yourself... here's another teaching I also always recommend people to watch, after they've watched the first two. Because often what follows or comes to mind next is; <u>How could all this have been missed?</u> That answer is explained in this teaching called;

In fact, you'll see wording a little later on, that shows Jesus knew this would not be widely understood about Him at this time!

But why is it so crazy to believe, when it's spoken about dozens of times in scripture. From Noah to Jonah to the Lord Himself? Well, today you're about to understand for yourself, from all three of them, that it's not at all crazy... it's a downright fact!. *The Son of man is coming for 40 Days, first!*

I know many right now will say, but Jesus told us not to believe people saying they're Him coming in His name? Like these scriptures below.

Mat 24:5 For many <u>shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ</u>; and shall deceive many. Or how about

Mar 13:6 For many <u>shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ</u>; and shall deceive many. And how about

Luk 21:8 And he said, Take heed that ye be not deceived: for many <u>shall come in my name, saying</u>, <u>I am Christ;</u> and the time draweth near: go ye not therefore after them.

What do they all have in common? "*shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ*". Let me ask you? When Christ was here did He go around telling everyone He was the Christ? No, He did not! People came to believe He was and others accused Him of being so. But never do we read of Jesus going around to groups of people telling them all He was the Christ.

And THAT Brothers and Sisters IS the difference! <u>He did not and will not</u> be going around telling everyone He's the Christ!

For what comes next, if you haven't yet watched the two videos above, you're going to feel a little lost? But I promise you once you've watched them. This will have you excited and seeking Him more then you have before:)

For generations people have argued that there are contradictions in the scriptures. And this one is one of them they debate. It's the story of Jonah in the gospels. Let's have a look.

Luk 11:29 ...they seek a sign; and *there shall no sign be given it*, <u>but the sign of Jonas the prophet</u>. Luk 11:30 For <u>as Jonas was a sign</u> unto the Ninevites, <u>so shall also the Son of man be to this</u> <u>generation</u>.

Mar 8:12 ... Why doth this generation seek after a sign? verily I say unto you, <u>*There shall no sign be given unto this generation*</u>.

Mar 8:13 And he left them, and entering into the ship again departed to the other side.

Mat 12:39 ...and there shall no sign be given to it, <u>but</u> the sign of the prophet Jonas: Mat 12:40 For <u>as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly</u>; <u>so shall the Son of</u> <u>man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth</u>.

So right away we can see the clear contradiction in Mark especially. And that's the one debated most. How is it Jesus said he would be as Jonah, in Luke and Matthew? Yet in Mark tell them, you get nothing and He leaves? But as you'll see there's more going on here! It's not just that Mark is told nothing. There's also that Luke is told one portion and Matthew is told his is a different portion? And what is it in Luke's that He tells them, <u>He'll be **a sign** as Jonah was</u>?

**Here's a little side note to help understand what's going on in the Synoptic Gospels. We've all heard the term, "<u>Was, and Is, and Is to Come</u>". We've been taught, "was" as the history of it, "is" as the life lessons for us to take from scripture, and the "is to come" as it would apply to the end times. However, there's even more to this, then what we've been taught.

And that is, that Luke will represent the "was" (pre trib). Mark, the "is" (mid trib). And Matthew, the "is to come" (post trib).

That is what's happening here in the story given to us by all three, about Jonah.

This is also the revelation in the first video; Who The Gospels Are Speaking To!

Let me elaborate. We've all been taught and understand the 3 days were after His crucifixion to His resurrection, and we also know that He was then 40 days on the earth. However, Jesus told us in Luke's version, that He would be... <u>as Jonah was</u>? What did Jonah do during his 40 days? He <u>gave</u> them a **warning** of what was about to happen to them, if they didn't heed his words and repent? So that would mean Jesus did not yet do as Jonah did, His first time around? Sure He had a 40 day event, <u>but He did not do as Jonah did</u>, like He said He would in Luke 11?

As for Mark and Matthew's understanding of how their Jonah story relates to the end times. It's not today's focus. It would take too much time and get us too far off the topic of His coming 40 days!

So back to Luke's version. You can clearly see the Lord did not yet do as Jonah did? And now you can begin to understand... He still has to fulfill... a 40 day Warning!

Let's move on now to a very, telling piece of scripture to shed more light on this. It's one of my favorite parts of scripture to show this understanding. And you'll see that it reveals not only more about the 40 days, but also more about Mark and Matthew's times, which in this case I will briefly touch on, because it won't take us too far off the path:) So let's go to it;

Luk 17:24 For <u>as the lightning</u>, that lighteneth out of the one part under heaven, shineth unto the other part under heaven; so shall also <u>the Son of man be in his day</u>.

Luk 17:25 But first must he suffer many things, and be rejected of this generation.

Luk 17:26 And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man.
Luk 17:27 They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all.

Luk 17:28 Likewise also as it was <u>in the days of Lot</u>; they did eat, they drank, <u>they bought, they</u> <u>sold</u>, they planted, they builded;

Luk 17:29 But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all.

Luk 17:30 Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed.

Now again, the Mark and Matthew portions are not the point of this teaching. However, I'm going to quickly show them to you. Then move into Luke's 40 day portion and show you where it leads us to from there.

In Luke 17:24 you'll notice He starts by telling them the End! And how do we know? He tells them His "<u>day</u>" will be like lightning from one part of heaven to the other. This is Matthew's portion. Just as we read in **Matthew 24:27** For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

In **Luke 17:28** you'll notice some very interesting words? "<u>they bought, they sold</u>". Interesting how that wording is found in that portion? Remember a big focus during the tribulation of Seals is going to be having or not having the ability to <u>"buy or sell"</u>, due to the mark of the beast? And if you continue down to verse 30. You'll notice it says "when the Son of man is revealed". This is not the 40 days? This is after the 6th seal. As we read in;

Rev 6:16 And said to the mountains and rocks, Fall on us, and <u>hide us from the face of him that</u> <u>sitteth on the throne</u>, **and from the wrath of the Lamb**:

Rev 6:17 For the great day of his wrath is come; and who shall be able to stand?

As you can see this is at the end time of Seals, and the mark of the beast, when the Lord will come to be revealed, coming on Mount Zion... the stone that will become a great mountain!

Now back to the 40 days! You'll notice in **Luke 17:25**, after He's told us His Matthew portion when He'll come as lightning in His day. That verse 25 then says some Very Important words... "**But First**"! He then tells us, He's going to have to suffer many things and be rejected.... This is where we must question and say, wait a minute, what's the context of this conservation? The context, <u>Is The Answer!</u> The entire context in this portion of Luke 17, <u>is about His coming Kingdom</u>!!! They're asking Him is it now? How will we know? And He goes on to tell them about it! He then tells them what it's going to be like when time is approaching! He's not telling them anything about the time they're in? He's clearly giving them prophecy, because that was not yet the time of His Kingdom?

And so what is this "<u>But First</u>"? He goes on to tell us in verse 26. That His "day**S**" will be as the "days" of Noah? Well which days could those be? First of all we see in verse 24 He said His "day". Whereas in verse 26 He's now telling us His "day**S**". So this adds more clarity to the fact that this is another portion of time, besides the obvious "<u>But First</u>". And He's also telling us, going into verse 27, that these "day**S**" He's going to be here for, relate to Noah? But more than that. He tells us exactly how many days they are. By telling us it was, "<u>until</u>", Noah got in the ark and the flood came! And how long was this time? You got it, <u>40 days</u>! Let's go to the story itself and see what He's referring us to makes sense in this time? And let's remember the end time context we're looking at, is a portion of time called "<u>above</u>" the 14 years. Let's see what it tells us?

This story of Noah and the ark is given to us in Gen.7 and 8. We see GOD telling Noah, in **Gen 7:4** <u>For yet seven days</u>, and I will cause it to rain upon the earth forty days and forty nights;.... And we see he starts loading in his family and the animals, etc.... By verse 10 we see the seven days <u>have passed</u> and the flood has begun.

Gen 7:10 And it came to pass after seven days, that the waters of the flood were upon the earth.

The 40 days have started! Now let's go to the main part of this story that Jesus is referring us to, from Luke 17, to understand His connection to <u>the 40 days</u> being "<u>before</u>" or "<u>above</u>" 14 years and right before the Tribulation begins!

Gen 8:6 And <u>it came to pass at **the end of forty days**</u>, that <u>Noah opened the window</u> of the ark which he had made:

Gen 8:7 And he <u>sent forth a raven</u>, which went forth to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off the earth.

Gen 8:8 <u>Also he sent forth **a dove**</u> from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground;

Gen 8:9 But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters were on the face of <u>the whole earth</u>: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the ark.

Gen 8:10 And he stayed yet other seven days; and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark;Gen 8:11 And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf pluckt off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth.

Gen 8:12 And he stayed yet other seven days; and sent forth the dove; which returned not again unto him any more.

Gen 8:13 And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark,...

Now here again, let me quickly touch on the points for Mark and Matthew first, because they won't take us too far off track. Then come back again to the 40 day connection Jesus is referring us to.

Again remembering that the tribulation time of Seals and Trumpets is 14 years. Did you notice that "after" the 40 days, we read in verses 10 and 12, Seven days and Seven days? Let's look at Mark's portion first. You'll notice this first 7 (days being as years) has passed in verse 10, when the dove returns. Except only this time, it has an <u>olive leaf "**pluckt**</u>" off! Well, if Mark's portion is the end of Seals rapture, as stated earlier by "was caught up". And that the reference "was" meant that one "was" the rapture and not as the first one called "such as one" or "like" or "similar" to a rapture. Then let us look at the meaning of the word for "caught up"? It's the Greek word G726 Harpazo, meaning, catch (away, up), **pluck**. Or *"was" pluckt"*! Fitting isn't it? And consider also that we're told the Gentiles were "grafted in", as a wild olive branch into the true olive tree?

Rom 11:17 And if some of the branches be broken off, and thou, being a wild olive tree, wert graffed in among them, and with them partakest of the root and fatness of the olive tree;

So you can see why the dove, after this first 7, has the <u>olive leaf "**pluckt** off</u>"? Mark's mid trib Rapture!

As for Matthew's portion we read in verse 12 that the dove goes out again after its second 7 and it <u>returns no more</u>! Well understanding this is now the end of tribulation. And the 14 days/ years are over. Which is the end of Matthew's portion. Let's go see what the end of Matthew tells us?

Mat 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, <u>All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth</u>.

Mat 28:19 Go ye therefore, and <u>teach all nations</u>, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

Mat 28:20 <u>Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you</u>: *and, lo*, I am with you alway, *even unto the end of the world.* Amen.

End of Matthew's portion, post trib, the Lord returns no more to heaven. Because He will now remain on earth with them... until the end of it!

Now back to the beginning of this story and <u>the 40 days</u>? Where do we find the 40... "<u>Above</u>" the 14! And what did Jesus clearly tell us in **Luke 17:25** "<u>But First</u>"... And what did Paul tell us in **2Cor.12:2** ... "<u>Above</u>" 14 years ago...

He was telling us... that His day"s" will be 40, that they will come "first", will be "before" the 14 years (7 of seals and 7 of trumpets) begin, and that during those 40 days, He will do as Jonah did, Warn the people!!! Unfortunately, He then also tells us during this time... He'll be rejected!

Let's continue. Where do we find the first account of the <u>Holy Ghost/ Dove</u> in the new testament? Acts 2. And when was that? <u>After the 40 days of the Son of man</u> from Luke 24 into Acts 1. So in the old testament the first place the Dove shows up is in Gen.8:8, as we've just covered. And we've just shown how it's representing the same type and shadow of the Pentecost story and time frame of the Holy Ghost, after the 40 days of the flood portion, to the Dove. So let's look closer to see what this storyline from the new testament tells us?

Let's take this one in reverse from Acts 2, when the Dove/ Holy Ghost comes at Pentecost. And let's see this same type and shadow we're following from the ark story, when the dove is first seen and sent out. With this same biblical pattern seen between the two. It would mean as we keep going in reverse we'd then end up at the beginning of Luke 24. The story of His resurrection and the beginning of His 40 days!

Now for those who have watched the first video, Who The Gospels Are Speaking To. You'll really see this part clearly and why this piece of scripture is spoken the way it is in Luke, while Mark and Matthew's resurrection accounts are both very different. Let's have a brief look;

Luk 24:3 And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. Luk 24:4 And it came to pass, as they were <u>much perplexed</u> thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments:

Mar 16:5 And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted.

Mat 28:2 And, behold, there was a great earthquake: for the angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it.Mat 28:3 His countenance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow:

Not only do you notice all three are different and yes there's a reason we can explain, which is directly tied into the teaching of Who The Gospels Are Speaking To. But for what we're looking to understand more clearly now. You'll notice <u>only Luke's gospel says that His</u> "**BODY**" *was not found!* Now consider everything being revealed in connection to His coming 40 days and that the Bride of Christ must be removed before His 40 days begin? ... <u>HIS BODY WAS NOT FOUND</u>! Then we see Him show up on the third day starting in;

Luk 24:15 And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned, <u>Jesus himself</u> <u>drew near, and went with them</u>.

So what or why then was the word "Body" used only in Luke's account? Because it was letting us know when His Bride / His Body would become one!

This ended up going a little beyond just the 40 days. But what an exciting place to bring it back to! The Beginning... When Him and His Bride Become One Body!

So now again consider what Paul said in **2Cor.12:2**, as the "<u>above</u>" portion and the time it represents? He told us that that time <u>began</u> when the <u>one in Christ</u>, <u>was taken</u> to the Third Heaven!

As great a place that might have been to end it. I want to end it with one more piece of evidence. But it's not from the Bible. It comes from one of the enemy's playbooks. I like to share this whenever I talk about the 40 days, because it's quite eye opening. Some will say, why is it in one of the enemy's books and not our own? Well, I just shared with you that it is in our book, His Word. We simply hadn't yet understood how to read it properly? And there's one big reason Why? We've all been taught from the last book in the story (Matthew). That's what's caused us to miss, more than half of the understanding of the end time story!

As for my answer as to why, what I'm going to show you, is in one of their books? I believe the answer is quite simple. The enemy has told them ahead of time, so that he hopefully doesn't lose any to the truth, when the Son of man does come and is performing many incredible miracles during those days. But again, consider what Jesus said in Luke 17:25? Remember what I said at the beginning... most won't believe it? I said that, because the bible told me so! The reason is because of Jesus' own words from:

Luk 17:25 But first must he suffer many things, and be rejected of this generation.

So what evidence do we have from one of the enemy's books that I like to share? It's the story of the coming of, The Dajjal. The Muslims call the Dajjal, the Christian anti-christ. As you'll see he clearly is not the Christian anti-christ. But most will not understand:(And how can we know for sure? Well the easy answer, is that it's in one of their books for one! But let me share with you the main points of this person, compared to their two guys coming after him? They say this Dajjal person will be here for 40 days. And that he'll be doing so many incredible miracles which include,

(copied from Wikipedia Dajjal page, below)... such as healing the sick, <u>raising the dead</u> (although only when supported by his demonic followers it seems), causing the earth to grow vegetation, causing livestock to prosper and to die and <u>stopping the sun's movement</u>.^[6] <u>His miracles resemble those performed by Jesus</u>. <u>The relation between the two is obscure</u>.

They say he'll be doing such incredible miracles that it will be hard to distinguish between what Jesus did when he was here, and what this person will do!!! Helloooo? Here's more from Wikipedia about the days... We asked: How long will he remain on the earth? He replied: Forty days

And they go on to say that once their two people come, who they say will be the "real" Jesus (we know this one will be the false prophet) and the other will be their Mahdi (we know will be the anti-christ). This "real" Jesus of there's, will go after this Dajjal person and get rid of him! And then their Mahdi will rule for either 6, 7 or 9 years? We know here, that this rule will be more like 6 years and a little, during the Seals portion, before the rapture of Mark's group in the 7th year Sabbath of Seals.

Are you now seeing why the Son of man will be rejected? Are you understanding? The Left Behind church has no idea who He'll be!

Now you see how confused the church is and why this is so important! Everyone's out there telling everyone else it's 7 years and the anti-christ comes first? Although anti-christ does come at the start of the 14 years... *he does not come first!*

Hence the importance of understanding the revelation, *by Jesus in Luke 17* and Luke 11! He, Jesus, as the Son of man, Will Be Here <u>for 40 days</u>. "<u>Before</u>" the anti-christ comes on the scene. <u>To warn the people</u>, even in the midst of rejection... again!

Please note: that although He'll be rejected, there will be some that come to Him believing and knowing who He is. And they will become His apostles and disciples! These will be those who will receive the End Time Acts 2.0 (we call it), Holy Ghost anointing on the 50th day! To lead the great end time revival during the tribulation of Seals!

For all out there listening to this or reading it before it begins? Seek Him now and take comfort in Him, knowing that His Bride will not take part in any of this! For those reading this shortly after His Bride has been taken, tens of millions of people having vanished! Know that the first person on the scene giving warning and doing incredible miracles <u>IS the Son of man fulfilling His 40 days Warning</u>! And for those after this period of time. When the Son of man is gone. Know and understand that the two that will have come on the scene, ARE the anti-christ (Mahdi) and the false prophet (who they will call Jesus). Do not follow them at any cost. But hit your knees, call out to Jesus Christ, repent and ask Him to forgive you all your sins and to guide you in this time in His will! I promise He will hear you!
